MEANING AND SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CREST OF ST AGNES PU COLLEGE



The Crest / Emblem has three parts the CROWN on top the SHIELD in the centre and the SCROLL below

The CROWN set in gold is encrusted with costly jewels and precious stones. In the past centuries, kings regarded the crown as a symbol of power, prestige and glory. In the context of our Motherland the crown acquires a new meaning, symbolizing the golden age of India's material wealth and cultural splendour. Today, through the education of her women, St Agnes PU College endeavours to recrown Bharath Matha. Educated and self-reliant women are jewels in the golden crown of Mother India.

The SHIELD has three partitions - In the first is depicted a CROSS atop a MOUNTAIN with THREE STARS on three sides. The Mountain is a symbol of Prayer and Contemplation; the Cross, a symbol of Christianity, reminds us that Christian Higher Education imparted by the College is imbued with the Teachings of Christ and the Spirit of His Person. The Three Stars signify the historical Carmelite Heritage of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation.

In the second partition is engraved a COCONUT PALM on the shoreline. It stands for the foundation of the Apostolic Carmel along the Western Coast of South India in 1870. The coconut tree with its association of 'Kalpa Vraksha' is symbolic of the quiet dependability and usefulness of the educational mission of the College.

In the third partition the LAMB with the victory PALM together represent our Patroness St Agnes and her spiritual victory. She sacrificed her life in defence of the virtue of chastity and remained steadfast in her consecration to Christ. The PALM is a symbol of victory over evil. To persevere in the practice of the virtues of modesty, purity and chastity we need to exercise daily self-control. Prayer helps us to control our carnal desires and say 'NO' to temptation. The Palm signals this triumph.

The SCROLL upholds our College Motto, "DEUS FORTITUDO MEA." Translated from Latin it means GOD IS MY STRENGTH. Living a meaningful life is an impossible task unless we have light and strength from above. Our College Anthem echoes with the inspiring message of these words.

THE CREST, AS A WHOLE, INSPIRES THE AGNESIAN TO LOOK UPTO AND REALISE IN HER LIFE A HIGHER IDEALISM AND SPIRITUALITY.

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PREAMBLE

St Agnes Pre-University College, Mangaluru started by The Apostolic Carmel Sisters in 1920, is a Minority Educational Institution as per the Constitutions of India, Article No.30 (1). From its very inception it has been imparting quality education to students of all castes and creeds without distinction. Historically it is the First Catholic Women's College established in South India and the Second in the country.

The Apostolic Carmel Congregation was founded by Venerable Mother Veronica of the Passion (1823-1906) in Bayonne, France in 1868 and was established at St Ann's campus in Mangaluru in 1870 with its main thrust, the development of women in India as persons imbued with deep faith in God and in themselves by providing sound Catholic Education.

The Apostolic Carmel is in its post Sesquicentennial year and over the past hundred and fifty years of its existence, the Institute has expanded with a large number of educational establishments in India, Sri Lanka, Middle East, Pakistan, Italy and East Africa.

St Agnes PU College was registered under the Societies' Registration Act XXI of 1860 under the title 'The Apostolic Carmel Educational Society' on the 12th of February 1957.

ST AGNES, THE PATRONESS OF THE COLLEGE LIVES ON TRIUMPHANTLY



From times now shrouded in the midst of history comes to us Agnes, Roman maiden, virgin and martyr, chosen as she has been, a patron saint of a women's college. This college, our Alma Mater, a pioneer in education for young women, is very much a product of 20th century thinking, and of a cultural and social awakening with regard to the rights and roles of women. Then, why Agnes? one may ask. How does she embody the qualities of head and heart that young girls today would do well to inculcate?

In a world where daily life is a challenge with political and social instability, technological and information revolutions, conflicting value systems and the erosion of the family as a unit, it would do us well to recall that St Agnes at thirteen, faced challenges no less formidable for her times. She defended her faith, and steeled herself against the vices, decadent traditions and attractions of Patrician society, as also against the alternate pleas and threats of her suitor Procus, son of a Roman Prefect.

To be a Christian in her times meant to embrace a faith that was alien to the authorities of Rome, Christianity was not merely politically incorrect, but also regarded as dangerous. In her steadfastness Agnes displayed an extraordinary degree of moral and physical courage and the strength to stand virtually alone in the face of Rome's wrath.

In a society where values warp all too easily and commitment seems old-fashioned, it is inspiring to think of Agnes' commitment to Christ, the Christ of Calvary, of the Cross and of the Resurrection. She followed Him to the pain and glory of death at the block.

While this institution looks at the 21st century squarely and steadily in the face, St Agnes, far from receding in significance serves as an ideal, capturing the imagination, firing the heart and illuminating the way for generations of young women.

MOTHER ALOYSIA

The Founder of St Agnes PU College, Mangaluru

Taking some extracts from the book, 'A Woman to Remember' - life and works of Mother Aloysia, we present the following write-up to the staff, students and their parents to serve as a source of inspiration.

Mother Aloysia, the Second Superior General of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation is proclaimed as a woman of faith, mettle, and farsighted visionary for development and progress. Mother Aloysia was essentially a self-made woman, who could never rest contented with being a back number. Very few were the facilities for education during her time.

She possessed a wonderful intuitive genius for educating herself and others. She encouraged the old and the young to do all they could to gain knowledge, adding that intellectual and spiritual progress were closely connected.

"Never", she would say, "live in a contented ignorance, nor rest satisfied with knowledge gained yesterday." She ever had her fingers on the pulse of the times and marched onwards, requiring the same of her staff. She was a Teacher and Educationist par excellence. Her greatest contribution to Women's Education rests in the founding of St Agnes PU College by her, in 1920.

The burning torch of higher education held aloft and handed on by St Agnes PU College has its source and origin in the philosophy and teaching of its Foundress Mother Aloysia. The background to the starting of this institution of higher learning was the profound thinking

of Mother Aloysia: "... Mother Aloysia realized, too, that at this point in world history when women as wives and mothers held the destinies of the nation in their hands, they should first be moulded to ideals answering to their highest concept of life.

Hence, with her long and varied experience of children, Mother Aloysia had become alarmingly aware of the modern tendencies in girls Their unhealthy love of freedom, their rage for modern amusements and pastimes, their attractions for frivolities and fashions, the danger of their losing control and, above all, that blindest of tendencies to cast at the feet of the first bidder that came their way, their heart's affection, that noblest of gifts."

"The underlying principle of Mother Aloysia's monumental work and activities was to guarantee to young women a complete religious, social and cultural formation. On this basic principle she built up her educational policy. She rightly understood the true meaning of education. Her concept of it was not restricted to mere booklore, but extended to a wide sphere of knowledge together with a thorough formation of the mind and intellect. Side by side she realized that education would be incomplete and defective if it lacked the essential quality - the formation of character."

It is hoped that the staff and management who run St Agnes PU College will imbibe the qualities of Mother Aloysia's personality and life, so that they aim at continuing to foster the spirit shown by her. Consequently it is hoped too, that the words of the then students of Mother Aloysia might ring true in the hearts of the students today also: "... Go where we may, the sound principles of religion and morality Mother Aloysia sought to instil in us in her own inimitable motherly way, will ever remain to guide our footsteps and keep us on the right path."

We firmly believe that Mother Aloysia's life and philosophy remains absolutely relevant to the present times. Her life and her precepts will serve as an inspiration to the staff in order to help them become effective educators in the field of Christian Higher Education today.

PARENTS

As co-operators with the educational institution, the parents collaborate with the Management and the Staff to carry out effectively the Mission of the College and the objectives spelt out.

It is desirable for Parents to

- Familiarize themselves with the Mission, Aims and Objectives of the College.
- Interact with the Principal and the Staff to ensure the all-round development of their children.
- Take full responsibility to deepen the values inculcated in their children in the College.
- Co-operate with the members of the staff and look upon the education of the students as a joint endeavour.
- Supervise the daily studies of the students at home and monitor their attendance in the College.
- Seek permission from the Principal if they need to meet their child.
- Take note of the fact that the students will not be permitted to appear for the Final Examination in the following cases:
 - (i) Students who are not regular in attending classes.
 - ii) Students who miss answering tests and terminal examinations.
 - (iii) Students whose performance in the terminal examinations is unsatisfactory.
 - (iv) Students who deliberately disobey the disciplinary rules laid down by the College.
 - (v) Students whose parents have failed to assume their responsibilities which are made known to them by this College.

Parents of students whose performance is unsatisfactory are required to meet the respective lecturers after the examination.

If, for any particular reason, students fail to appear for the examination, parents are expected to meet the staff-in-charge and inform her in person.

- Students may take part in activities of an inter-collegiate nature representing the college only when authorized to do so by the Principal. At such gatherings they are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that brings honour and credit to their parents and the college.
- If the students are desirous of attending activities of an intercollegiate nature individually, held in other colleges and public
 centers, it is entirely the responsibility of the parents to arrange for
 them to be chaperoned. The College will not hold itself responsible
 for them in these circumstances.
- Parents are alerted to take note of student's participation in any social gathering held by private parties in the name of St Agnes PU College.
- If the College holds any such functions, they will be authorized by the Principal and the student-group will always be accompanied by a member of the staff. Verification can be sought from the College prior to the event.

As long as the child is a student of this College, the College authorities will communicate only with the parents or approved guardian (if parents are not alive) for all purposes.

THE PUBLIC

The College holds itself responsible to maintain cordial and beneficial relations with the Pre-University Board, the Government, Non-Governmental Organizations and other educational institutions in order to extend its Mission and mutually share the fruits of education.

HOLISTIC EDUCATION IN THE COLLEGE

SPIRITUAL MINISTRY

- 1. The college upholds the primacy of God, the importance of prayer, and the call to selfless service. Prayer is an integral part of the curriculum, fostering spiritual growth alongside academic pursuits. Students are encouraged to strengthen their spiritual life through both secular studies and dedicated spiritual programs.
- 2. Faith formation of Catholic students is a vital responsibility of the institution. Once a month, an hour is set aside for the celebration of the Holy Mass or spiritual enrichment sessions, to deepen their faith and values.
- 3. Students of other faiths actively participate in regular value education classes and are given opportunities for spiritual reflection interfaith harmony, ethical living and moral integrity.

THE COLLEGE CABINET

- 1. The College Cabinet plays a vital role in coordinating student discipline and activities. It comprises the Student President, Vice President, Sports Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Student Editor, and Stream Secretaries.
- 2. Candidates contesting for cabinet elections must embody a spirit of service and commitment to student welfare.
- 3. Candidates must demonstrate strong leadership qualities and have a proven record of achievements in the area they wish to represent.
- 4. The College Cabinet is responsible for upholding academic standards, striving for excellence, and ensuring quality in all student activities and programs in alignment with vision and mission of the college.
- 5. Students with any history of malpractice are ineligible to contest.
- 6. Candidates must have successfully passed in all examinations and maintained the required attendance in the first year.

- 7. Those contesting for the position of Sports Secretary must have passed the I PUC final examination and participated in at least one State or National-level tournament.
- 8. All candidates must undergo the mandatory Leadership Training programme organized by the college.
- 9. The Cabinet functions under the guidance of the Vice Principal, who provides regular mentorship and direction.
- 10. The final decision regarding the list of eligible contestants rests with the designated college authority after reviewing the nomination letters.

GOOD PRACTICES FOR THE SAFETY AND PROTECTION OF STUDENTS IN THE COLLEGE

- The entire college building, including classrooms, laboratories, verandas, the cafeteria is under CCTV surveillance.
- Regular maintenance of the building is ensured.
- A security guard is stationed at the main gate and the college entrance gate both during the day and at night.
- Students are restricted from leaving the college during lunch break. However, in case of an emergency, they may leave the premises with written permission.
- Students residing in PG accommodations or external hostels are provided with a pass for lunch to move out of the premises.
- Students are issued an ID card that includes their parents' contact number and other necessary details. A college ID is mandatory for staff as well.
- Prior to any program or event, an SMS notification is sent to parents. Students staying back for practice sessions and programs must leave the campus by 4:15 PM.
- Parents are personally informed when students fall ill and an entry is made in the register.
- Attendance registers are maintained and updated after every hour.

- SMS notifications of absentees are sent to parents daily through college app.
- Parents and visitors are not allowed to enter classrooms directly at any time of the day.
- First Aid facility is available in case of emergencies.
- Students with fractures or disabilities are permitted to use the lift with prior approval.
- A student counsellor is available throughout the week.

THE PARENT - TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

- (I) All Parents of the students on the roll of the PU college become member of the PTA
- (II) If a student has lost both her parents, her legal guardian becomes the member of the association. Parents who are abroad will appoint a guardian while admitting their child to the College and the guardian will participate in the activities of the PTS in the place of parents. however, only parents have the active voice to be elected as members of the Executive Committee of the PTA.
- (III) The College maintains a strong philosophy that the ongoing efforts / programmes directed towards the growth and well being of our students will become fruitful only when parents and teachers join hands, interact closely and act jointly in all educational endeavours.

The Parents/Guardians (not sibling) have the responsibility to attend the Annual General Meeting of the PTA. Meeting of the parents with the lecturers is found mutually enriching. This is an opportunity for the parents to clarify points and get help that might be needed.

The college offers a variety of facilities to promote the wellbeing of students and to make life on the campus comfortable and convenient.

NCC guides and provides a suitable environment for developing discipline, responsibility and dynamism among the students. SPORTS RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. A parental consent letter is mandatory for any student wishing to join sports.
- 2. Students who opt for various sports events must be punctual for practice sessions and meetings scheduled by the Physical Director.
- 3. Once a student commits to a sport, she is not permitted to withdraw for any reason. Students must also be prepared to participate in intercollegiate matches, including those held out of station.
- 4. Students may choose to join either **Sports or NCC**, but not both.

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS:

IDENTITY AND CALENDAR

Students must wear their college identity card at all times while on campus. A student without an ID card will not be allowed to enter the college building.

In case of loss of the ID card, the student must inform the Vice Principal immediately and apply for a replacement. Duplication or misuse of the ID card will be dealt strictly.

Any staff member or lawful authority of the PU College has the right to ask a student to produce them at any time.

The identity card is mandatory for Library access and book borrowing and appearing for college examinations.

DRESS CODE

Every student represents the college's standards in terms of dress and deportment. Simplicity, modesty, and propriety must be maintained in attire. No other clothing is permitted on the college premises during working hours.

 The uniform prescribed by the college must be worn on all regular working days. Any form of fashionable alteration or modification is strictly prohibited. Boys must keep their shirts tucked in at the waist.

- 2. Boys: Full-length trousers and half-sleeved shirts.
- 3. Girls: Trousers and three-fourth sleeved shirts with scarf.
- 4. Saturday Attire: T-shirts and black jeans (tucking in is not required).
- 5. Black sandals are mandatory. Slippers, gaudy footwear, or shoes in any colour other than black is not allowed.
- 6. Tattoo, hair colouring, fancy hairstyle and any form of body piercing is strictly prohibited.
- 7. Students are not allowed to wear any headgear, including scarfs, cap or hat within the college premises.
- 8. The dress code applies during examinations and college fests.

DISCIPLINE

Discipline is an essential aspect of student life. Serious offenses will result in strict disciplinary action, with an initial warning given where applicable.

- 1. During lunch break, no student, (except PG students) is allowed to leave through the main or side gate.
- 2. No meetings shall be held within the college premises, nor shall any new activity be initiated without the approval of the Principal.
- 3. No collection of money or sale of tickets is permitted without prior permission from the Principal.
- 4. Students must use classroom furniture with care. Damaging furniture, scribbling on walls, or etching on planks, desks, or chairs is considered a serious offense fine will be collected. Sum of which will be utilized to varnish the furniture on a regular basis.
- 5. Outsiders are not permitted to attend college functions. Strict action will be taken against students who bring outsiders onto the campus.
- 6. Students involved in theft or damage to college property will be penalised. All belongings should have a name or identify mark. Any lost, stray, or unclaimed property must be submitted to the Vice Principal's office immediately.
- 7. Details of the late comers will be recorded in the page no. 55 habitual late coming is unacceptable.

- 8. The use of foul language or abusive speech is strictly prohibited and will be dealt seriously.
- 9. The college is not responsible for any misconduct of students outside its premises.
- 10. Boys must maintain neat, short-trimmed hair, Clean-shaven facial hair is preferred. Earrings, bangles, or bracelets are not allowed.
- 11. Girls must keep their hair neatly tied, avoid excessive makeup and fancy accessories, and maintain a professional and appropriate appearance suitable for an educational setting.
- 12. Ragging is strictly prohibited on and around the campus. Ragging is a cognizable criminal offense, and those involved will be handed over to the law.
- 13. Students must refrain from smoking, consuming tobacco in any form, alcohol, or drugs. Strict disciplinary action will be taken against violators.
- 14. Books, magazines, newspapers, or any other reading material which is not approved by the college is not allowed.
- 15. Boys and girls are expected to conduct themselves with dignity and respect and observe norms of decency and propriety in their interactions.
- 16. The college conducts **extra coaching** for academically slow learners. Attendance is mandatory, and assigned work must be submitted to subject teachers. Failure to comply will be taken seriously.
- 17. Students shall not use the college address for personal correspondence. All letters addressed to students at the college will be redirected to their parents/guardians. The college is not responsible for any lost correspondence. Official letters to the Principal must include a self-addressed stamped enve-lope for a reply.

19. MOBILE PHONE POLICY:

- Mobile phones are strictly forbidden on campus as per the Pre-University Department order.
- If a student is found with a mobile phone, it will be confiscated and not returned for one year. No requests for early return will be entertained.

- In exceptional cases where a phone is needed, a request letter from the parent must be submitted to the class mentor. If approved, the phone must be deposited with the class mentor at the start of the day and collected at the end of the day.
- A copy of the permission letter must be carried at all times for verification. Students with permission is not allowed to take the phone into classrooms or use it before exiting the college gates.
- Violation of these regulations will result in the permanent withdrawal of permission and confiscation of the phone.
- 20. Students misusing social media to spread false, baseless, or defamatory content against students, staff, or the institution will face strict action under cyber laws. Penalty may lead to suspension or rustication.
- 21. Students are not permitted to bring self-driven vehicles to college. Violators will face vehicle seizure and legal action.
- 22. Celebrating birthdays or parties for staff and students is strictly prohibited. No gifts shall be given to staff members.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

- 1. The College Library is open only to the staff and students of the College.
- 2. The Library will be open every day from 8.45 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. On Saturdays 8.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m.
- 3. The Procedure to use the library is as follows:
 - (i) Every student who wishes to use the library shall produce her identity card at the entrance.
 - (ii) She/he shall keep her belongings on the rack kept outside the library. She/he will carry with her only the identity card, loose sheets of paper, pen and money purse (not bag).
 - (iii) She/he shall enter the library and use the reference section or magazine section for reading or taking down notes, which she/he shall do in perfect silence.

- (iv) When a student gets out of the library she/he cannot carry any book out of the library except the books issued to her/him.
- 4. Three Borrower's Tickets will be issued to every student at the beginning of the year. A student should present the Borrower's Ticket as well as identity card each time she/he wants a book to be issued or returned to the library. The Borrower's Tickets must be kept carefully by the student and are to be used for the entire course of study, until the student leaves the college. If the tickets are lost, the students should report the fact immediately to the librarian and make arrangements to get another set of tickets with a fine of Rs. 25 per ticket.

5. ISSUE OF BOOKS

- Books will be issued to the students on all the days of the week.
- ii) Students should apply for library books on the prescribed application slip which should be dropped into the box. Books will be issued to the students within 24 hours of application the latest.
- (iii) No student is allowed to take more than 3 books at a time (2 reference and 1 general).
- (iv) When a book which has been applied for, is not available, a reject slip will be issued. In this case the student may ask for another book in its place.
- (v) A reference book must be returned after a week. The book may, however, be renewed for another week, if there is no other application for the said book.
- (vi) From the lending library, books will be issued to the needy students. They may use these books for the full academic year and return them just after the final examination of the year.
- (vii) If a holiday falls on any of the days specified for the issuing of books, the librarian will notify on the board the alternate date for the issue of books for that particular week.

- (viii) In case of emergency when a student needs a book on a day other than the day specified for the issue of books, she will seek the help of the staff member concerned with the subject or the Librarian in case of a general book. Students shall note that the library is not a place of recreation or relaxation. Any student found misbehaving in the library shall surrender the identity card to the Librarian. Her case will be reported to the Principal by the Librarian. She will not be given any library facility until she gets the Principal's permission in writing.
- 6. All books, magazines, and furniture must be handled with care. Books lost, torn, defaced, marked, or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower along with the fine.
- 7. The students are requested to handle all the library properties carefully to avoid mutilation of the same.
- 8. The users must not mark, underline, write, tear pages, fold pages, or otherwise damage the library documents.

LABORATORY RULES

- 1. Students must be regular and punctual for all practical sessions in the laboratory.
- 2. All equipment and materials provided for practical work must be handled with care. Any damages or breakages must be compensated for. Strict silence must be maintained during practical sessions.
- 3. Entry into the laboratory is allowed only with the permission of the Lecturer-in-charge.
- 4. Students who are irregular in practical work are not eligible to answer PU Board Examination.
- 5. Students must remove their footwear and place them on the designated racks before entering the computer laboratory.
- 6. Students must bring their Laboratory manual, Observation notebook, Lab kit, Practical record book for every experiment.
- 7. Submission of the completed record book at every lab session is mandatory. Students who fail to do so will not be permitted to enter the lab.

8. Submission of a completed, approved and attached practical record is mandatory to be eligible for the final practical examination.

EXAM:

- 1. After every test and examination marks will be enabled in the college app to be viewed by the Parents and the students.
- 2. Students who copy (malpractice) in college exams are not allowed to write the remaining scheduled exams and answer scripts of the day will not be valued.
- 3. No student should absent herself from answering the class test/examination except for reasons approved and the letter signed by the Principal.

- 4. A student must put in a minimum of 75% attendance in every subject each year, taking theory and practicals as separate units.
- 5. Parents of students with a shortage of attendance will be called for a meeting.

ELIGIBILITY TO II PUC EXAMINATIONS:

Admission to II PUC Public Examination shall be open to candidates who have

- (i) Passed I Year PUC Annual Examination.
- (ii) Undergone prescribed course of study in the corresponding year.
- (iii) Secured the minimum attendance prescribed under the regulations.
- (iv) Shown satisfactory progress and conduct as certified by the Head of the Institution.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Parents are responsible for ensuring that their ward attends classes regularly and as a rule, does not seek exemption from attending daily classes.
- If an important occasion within the immediate family falls on a working day and requires student's presence for more than three days, a leave of absence (refer to page no. 50) must be applied for 15 days in advance by the parent. Such permission will not be granted if the occasion coincides with College Examinations, Prayer Day or Retreat.
- Parents must strictly avoid scheduling routine doctor's checkup for their ward during class hours.
- If a student is absent for more than three days due to illness, a medical certificate stating the illness and fitness for return is required.
- Students are not permitted to leave the college premises during college hours unless parents/guardians submit a written request to the Vice Principal before 9:00 AM.
- A student requiring leave for any part of the day due to sudden illness or unavoidable circumstances must obtain permission from the class teacher and Deans before leaving the college. An absence

record, signed by the parent/guardian, must be submitted on the next working day.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

Admissions are granted only for the current academic year with the explicit understanding that students will fully accept and adhere to the rules and regulations of the College. These regulations may be revised from time to time, regardless of whether they are included in the PUE board regulations or followed by other institutions.

Every student admitted to the College is bound by the College Regulations as notified periodically by the institution.

MERIT CERTIFICATES

Eligibility Criteria

- The student must appear for and pass every paper in the First Test and Mid-term Examination.
- A minimum of 75% attendance in all subjects is required.
- The student must achieve both:
 - The prescribed aggregate percentage of attendance in all subjects.
 - The prescribed minimum marks in individual subjects for the First Test and Mid-term Examination.
- Prescribed Aggregate: 80%
- Prescribed Minimum Marks in Individual Subjects:
 - 85% for Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Home Science, Statistics, Computer Science, Electronics, Basic Mathematics, Accountancy.
 - 80% for all other subjects

ISSUING OF CERTIFICATES

- 1. All applications for certificates must be submitted in writing to the Principal and must include the following details:
 - Full name and initials of the student

- Date of admission and the class in which the student was originally enrolled.
- Class and registration number at the time of leaving, along with the date of leaving
- Language studied under Part I and subjects under Part II
- 2. Certificates will be issued only after a minimum of 48 hours' notice from the time of application.
- 3. Certificates must be collected in person from the office.
- 4. No certificate or marks card will be handed over to any other person without a written letter of authorization from the student.
- 5. If certificates are to be sent by post, the student must provide a self-addressed registered envelope with the required postage and certification fee.
- 6. Transfer Certificates and other official documents will be issued only after all outstanding fees and dues have been cleared.
- 7. Students withdrawing from the institution after the First Year course will receive their Transfer Certificate and other documents only after the declaration of examination results.
- 8. The Official Conduct Certificate is not issued automatically; it must be earned through exemplary conduct and behavior during the PU course. The Principal reserves the right to deny the certificate if the student's conduct has been unsatisfactory.

PREAMBLE

WE. THE PEOPLE OF INDIA. having solemnly resolved to constitute India into a SOVEREIGN SOCIALIST SECULAR DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC and to secure to all its citizens: JUSTICE, social, economic and political; LIBERTY of thought, expression, belief, faith and worship; EQUALITY of status and of opportunity; and to promote among them all FRATERNITY assuring the dignity of the individual and the unity and integrity of the Nation; IN OUR CONSTITUENT ASSEMBLY this twenty-sixth day of November, 1949, do HEREBY ADOPT, ENACT AND GIVE TO **OURSELVES THIS CONSTITUTION**

VENERABLE MOTHER VERONICA, A WOMAN FOR OUR TIMES

Mother Veronica nee Sophie Leeves was born on Oct 1st, 1823 in Constantinople, in a cultured, English Anglican family. She was gifted with singular talents of mind and heart, which were nurtured by sound education and wide experience, as she was well travelled. God took possession of her heart so powerfully, that she first broke off her engagement to a Marine officer whom she loved, and then responded generously to the call to Religious life.

Mother Veronica was open and generous in responding to God's will, and after much struggle, she finally found the Congregation of the Apostolic Carmel in Bayonne, France in July 1868. Henceforth, her sisters across the globe would work enthusiastically for the upliftment of women through all-round education.

The first group of The Apostolic Carmelites arrived in India in November 1870. The first Convent was established at St Ann's (Mother house) in the Diocese of Mangaluru, Karnataka.

Today the Apostolic Carmel has spread its branches in 9 countries including Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Africa, Bahrain and Italy. In 181 convents in 75 dioceses, we now have nearly 1300 sisters working in Degree and postgraduate Colleges, B.Ed & M.Ed Colleges, D.Ed Colleges, Higher Secondary Schools, Special Schools, Nursery Schools, Play Schools, Technical Schools, Women's Welfare Centres, Créches, Healthcare Centres, Hostels, Boarding Houses, Children's Homes and Day Care Centre. It also has a number of Literacy Centers and National Open Schools. The sisters work for the training and rehabilitation of women and children in prison as well as working for the integral development of the poor and needy in rural and tribal areas.

Mother Veronica's heroic obedience to the will of God, her life of faith and prayer, her wholehearted commitment, outstanding humility and courage, remain as an inspiration to all who seek to dedicate themselves to the transformation of Society through the loving service of humanity, especially the less privileged.

Mother Veronica was declared 'Venerable' by His Holiness Pope Francis on July 7, 2014.
