MEANING AND SIGNIFICANCE OF THE CREST OF ST AGNES PU COLLEGE



The Crest / Emblem has three parts -
the CROWN on top
the SHIELD in the centre
and the SCROLL below

The CROWN set in gold is encrusted with costly jewels and precious stones. In the past centuries, kings regarded the crown as a symbol of power, prestige and glory. In the context of our Motherland the crown acquires a new meaning, symbolizing the golden age of India's material wealth and cultural splendour. Today, through the education of her women, St Agnes PU College endeavours to recrown Bharath Matha. Educated and self-reliant women are jewels in the golden crown of Mother India.

The SHIELD has three partitions - In the first is depicted a CROSS atop a MOUNTAIN with THREE STARS on three sides. The Mountain is a symbol of Prayer and Contemplation; the Cross, a symbol of Christianity, reminds us that Christian Higher Education imparted by the College is imbued with the Teachings of Christ and the Spirit of His Person. The Three Stars signify the historical Carmelite Heritage of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation.


In the second partition is engraved a COCONUT PALM on the shoreline. It stands for the foundation of the Apostolic Carmel along the Western Coast of South India in 1870. The coconut tree with its association of 'Kalpa Vraksha' is symbolic of the quiet dependability and usefulness of the educational mission of the College.

In the third partition the LAMB with the victory PALM together represent our Patroness St Agnes and her spiritual victory. She sacrificed her life in defence of the virtue of chastity and remained steadfast in her consecration to Christ. The PALM is a symbol of victory over evil. To persevere in the practice of the virtues of modesty, purity and chastity we need to exercise daily self-control. Prayer helps us to control our carnal desires and say 'NO' to temptation. The Palm signals this triumph.

The SCROLL upholds our College Motto, "DEUS FORTITUDO MEA." Translated from Latin it means GOD IS MY STRENGTH. Living a meaningful life is an impossible task unless we have light and strength from above. Our College Anthem echoes with the inspiring message of these words.

THE CREST, AS A WHOLE, INSPIRES THE AGNESIAN TO LOOK UP TO AND REALISE IN HER LIFE A HIGHER IDEALISM AND SPIRITUALITY.

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PREAMBLE

St Agnes Pre-University College, Mangaluru started by The Apostolic Carmel Sisters in 1920, is a Minority Educational Institution as per the Constitutions of India, Article No.30 (1). From its very inception it has been imparting quality education to students of all castes and creeds without distinction. Historically it is the First Catholic Women's College established in South India and the Second in the country.

The Apostolic Carmel Congregation was founded by Venerable Mother Veronica of the Passion (1823-1906) in Bayonne, France in 1868 and was established at St Ann's campus in Mangaluru in 1870 with its main thrust, the development of women in India as persons imbued with deep faith in God and in themselves by providing sound Catholic Education.

The Apostolic Carmel is in its post Sesquicentennial year and over the past hundred and fifty years of its existence, the Institute has expanded with a large number of educational establishments in India, Sri Lanka, Middle East, Pakistan, Italy and East Africa.

ST AGNES, THE PATRONESS OF THE COLLEGE LIVES ON TRIUMPHANTLY



From times now shrouded in the midst of history comes to us Agnes, Roman maiden, virgin and martyr, chosen as she has been, a patron saint of a women's college. This college, our Alma Mater, a pioneer in education for young women, is very much a product of 20th century thinking, and of a cultural and social awakening with regard to the rights and roles of women. Then, why Agnes? one may ask. How does she embody the qualities of head and heart that young girls today would do well to inculcate?

In a world where daily life is a challenge with political and social instability, technological and information revolutions, conflicting value systems and the erosion of the family as a unit, it would do us well to recall that St Agnes at thirteen, faced challenges no less formidable for her times. She defended her faith, and steeled herself against the vices, decadent traditions and attractions of Patrician society, as also against the alternate pleas and threats of her suitor Procus, son of a Roman Prefect.

To be a Christian in her times meant to embrace a faith that was alien to the authorities of Rome, Christianity was not merely politically incorrect, but also regarded as dangerous. In her steadfastness Agnes displayed an extraordinary degree of moral and physical courage and the strength to stand virtually alone in the face of Rome's wrath.

In a society where values warp all too easily and commitment seems old-fashioned, it is inspiring to think of Agnes' commitment to Christ, the Christ of Calvary, of the Cross and of the Resurrection. She followed Him to the pain and glory of death at the block.

While this institution looks at the 21st century squarely and steadily in the face, St Agnes, far from receding in significance serves as an ideal, capturing the imagination, firing the heart and illuminating the way for generations of young women.

MOTHER ALOYSIA

The Founder of St Agnes PU College, Mangaluru

Taking some extracts from the book, 'A Woman to Remember' - life and works of Mother Aloysia, we present the following write-up to the staff, students and their parents to serve as a source of inspiration.

Mother Aloysia, the Second Superior General of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation is proclaimed as a woman of faith, mettle, and far-sighted visionary for development and progress. Mother Aloysia was essentially a self-made woman, who could never rest contented with being a back number. Very few were the facilities for education during her time.

She possessed a wonderful intuitive genius for educating herself and others. She encouraged the old and the young to do all they could to gain knowledge, adding that intellectual and spiritual progress were closely connected.

"Never", she would say, "live in a contented ignorance, nor rest satisfied with knowledge gained yesterday." She ever had her fingers on the pulse of the times and marched onwards, requiring the same of her staff. She was a Teacher and Educationist par excellence. Her greatest contribution to Women's Education rests in the founding of St Agnes PU College by her, in 1920.

The burning torch of higher education held aloft and handed on by St Agnes PU College has its source and origin in the philosophy and teaching of its Foundress Mother Aloysia. The background to the starting of this institution of higher learning was the profound thinking

of Mother Aloysia: "... Mother Aloysia realized, too, that at this point in world history when women as wives and mothers held the destinies of the nation in their hands, they should first be moulded to ideals answering to their highest concept of life.

Hence, with her long and varied experience of children, Mother Aloysia had become alarmingly aware of the modern tendencies in girls. Their unhealthy love of freedom, their rage for modern amusements and pastimes, their attractions for frivolities and fashions, the danger of their losing control and, above all, that blindest of tendencies to cast at the feet of the first bidder that came their way, their heart's affection, that noblest of gifts."

"The underlying principle of Mother Aloysia's monumental work and activities was to guarantee to young women a complete religious, social and cultural formation. On this basic principle she built up her educational policy. She rightly understood the true meaning of education. Her concept of it was not restricted to mere booklore, but extended to a wide sphere of knowledge together with a thorough formation of the mind and intellect. Side by side she realized that education would be incomplete and defective if it lacked the essential quality - the formation of character."

It is hoped that the staff and management who run St Agnes PU College will imbibe the qualities of Mother Aloysia's personality and life, so that they aim at continuing to foster the spirit shown by her. Consequently it is hoped too, that the words of the then students of Mother Aloysia might ring true in the hearts of the students today also: "... Go where we may, the sound principles of religion and morality Mother Aloysia sought to instil in us in her own inimitable motherly way, will ever remain to guide our footsteps and keep us on the right path."

We firmly believe that Mother Aloysia's life and philosophy remains absolutely relevant to the present times. Her life and her precepts will serve as an inspiration to the staff in order to help them become effective educators in the field of Christian Higher Education today.

PARENTS

As co-operators with the educational institution, the parents collaborate with the Management and the Staff to carry out effectively the Mission of the College and the objectives spelt out.

◆ **It is desirable for Parents to**

- Interact with the Principal and the Staff to ensure the all-round development of their children.
- Take full responsibility to deepen the values inculcated in their children in the College.
- Co-operate with the members of the staff and look upon the education of the students as a joint endeavour.
- Supervise the daily studies of the students at home and monitor their attendance in the College.
- Seek permission from the Principal if they need to meet their child.
- Take note of the fact that the students will not be permitted to appear for the Final Examination in the following cases:
 - (i) Students who are not regular in attending classes.
 - ii) Students who miss answering tests and terminal examinations.
 - (iii) Students whose performance in the terminal examinations is unsatisfactory.
 - (iv) Students who deliberately disobey the disciplinary rules laid down by the College.
 - (v) Students whose parents have failed to assume their responsibilities which are made known to them by this College.

Parents of students whose performance is unsatisfactory are required to meet the respective lecturers after the examination.

If, for any particular reason, students fail to appear for the examination, parents are expected to meet the staff-in-charge and inform her in person.

- ❖ Students may take part in activities of an inter-collegiate nature representing the college only when authorized to do so by the Principal. At such gatherings they are expected to conduct themselves in a manner that brings honour and credit to their parents and the college.
- ❖ If the students are desirous of attending activities of an inter-collegiate nature individually, held in other colleges and public centers, it is entirely the responsibility of the parents to arrange for them to be chaperoned. The College will not hold itself responsible for them in these circumstances.
- ❖ Parents are alerted to take note of student's participation in any social gathering held by private parties in the name of St Agnes PU College.
- ❖ If the College holds any such functions, they will be authorized by the Principal and the student-group will always be accompanied by a member of the staff. Verification can be sought from the College prior to the event.

As long as the child is a student of this College, the College authorities will communicate only with the parents or approved guardian (if parents are not alive) for all purposes.

THE PUBLIC

The College holds itself responsible to maintain cordial and beneficial relations with the Pre-University Board, the Government, Non-Governmental Organizations and other educational institutions in order to extend its Mission and mutually share the fruits of education.

INTRODUCTION

St Agnes PU College is a Minority Institution, founded primarily for the education of Catholic Women. Yet from its very inception it has been imparting education to students of all castes and creeds without distinction. Historically it is the first Catholic Women's College established in South India and the second in the country.

MANAGEMENT: The **Apostolic Carmel** is a Congregation of Sisters aggregated to the Order of Discalced Carmelites, founded in 1868 by **Mother Veronica** of the Passion and established at Mangaluru, India, in 1870. The Sisters of the **Apostolic Carmel** run this Institution.

TITLE: St Agnes PU College was registered under the Societies' Registration Act XXI of 1860 under the title 'The Apostolic Carmel Educational Society' on the 12th of February 1957.

CATHOLIC LIFE IN THE COLLEGE

SPIRITUAL MINISTRY:

- Prayer forms an integral part of the curriculum. Emphasis is laid on leading the students to strengthen their spiritual life both through the secular studies and spiritual programmes. Every Catholic student, through the regular programmes conducted, seeks the nurturing of her faith in Christ and the deepening of her life in the Church.
- Faith Formation of the Catholic Students is considered as one of the important responsibilities of the Institution. Therefore students will have catechism classes once a week. The primacy of God, the importance of prayer and the need of selfless service is always upheld. Once a month, an hour is reserved for Catholic activity i.e. Mass or spiritual input sessions.
- Besides the weekly Catechism / Moral Education / Value Education classes, special days in the year are set aside for prayer and retreat.

THE COLLEGE CABINET

- Student discipline and activities are co-ordinated through the Student Cabinet of the College comprising the Student President, Vice President, Sports Secretary, Cultural Secretary, Student Editor and the Stream Secretaries.
- A candidate who wishes to contest for elections to the cabinet must aim at a spirit of service.
- She should have right leadership quality and also a record of achievements to her credit in the field which she wishes to head.
- She should have **passed in All the examinations** and should not have had shortage of attendance in I PU
- **Those who contest for Sports Secretary should have passed in I PUC final examinations and should have had participated in one State/ National level tournament.**
- She must not have had indulged in any kind of malpractice.
- She must necessarily undergo the Leadership Training course arranged by the college.
- The Cabinet functions under the direction of the Vice- Principal. She provides guidance to them on a regular basis.
- It is the responsibility of the College Cabinet to uphold academic standards, aim at excellence, maintain a high quality in all their activities and programmes, in keeping with the objectives and vision of the College.
- After going through the Nomination letter, final decision to list the contestants will rest on the respective authority of the college.

CHILD PROTECTION

Every institution thinks about the safety of the students. The school/College authorities work hand in hand to create a danger-free and comfortable environment to the students. The faculty of St Agnes PU College in collaboration with parents works for the safety and security of the students through Child Protection Committee. The

College upholds the standard by formulating the policies and framework to become aware of the near possible threats in safeguarding every student in the premises.

GOOD PRACTICES THAT ARE FOLLOWED FOR THE SAFETY AND PROTECTION OF THE STUDENTS IN THE COLLEGE

- The entire college building (classes, labs, veranda, cafeteria, entrance etc) is under CCTV surveillance.
- Regular maintenance of the building and infrastructure is seen to.
- Day & night security guard is present at the main gate as well as at the college entrance gate.
- Students moving out of college during lunch break is restricted. In an emergency, however, they are allowed to move out of the premises with written permission.
- Those who reside in PG/outside hostel are provided with gate pass for lunch.
- Students are provided with an ID card which includes the parents' contact no & other necessary details. College ID is compulsory for the staff too.
- Dried branches of the trees under which students sit during break time are trimmed every year.
- On the occasion of any program, SMS is sent to parents beforehand. Students staying back for practices & programmes leave the campus by 5 pm.
- Announcements related to safety are given constantly both by the Principal as well as the teachers.
- Parents are informed personally when students are sick and an entry for the same is made in the register.
- Attendance register is maintained for morning and afternoon.
- SMS regarding absentees is sent to parents daily in the morning and afternoon.
- Parents/strangers are not allowed to go directly to the classes at any time of the day.

- First Aid facility in emergency is available in college. For further treatment they are taken to hospital and parents are informed.
- Students with a fracture or any kind of disability are allowed to use the lift with permission.
- Wheelchair is available in case of an emergency.
- Student Counsellor is available throughout the week.

THE PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION (PTA)

- (i) All Parents of the students on the roll of the PU College become members of the PTA on payment of the membership fee. The membership fee is Rs. 150/- per student per academic year.
- (ii) If a student has lost both her parents, her legal guardian becomes the member of the Association. Parents who are abroad will appoint a guardian while admitting their child to the College and the guardian will participate in the activities of the PTA in the place of parents.

However, only Parents have the active voice to be elected as members of the Executive Committee of the PTA.

- (iii) The College maintains a strong philosophy that the ongoing efforts / programmes directed towards the growth and wellbeing of our students will become fruitful only when Parents and Teachers join hands, interact closely and act jointly in all educational endeavours.

The Parents/Guardians (not Siblings) have the responsibility to attend the Annual General Body Meeting of the PTA. Meeting of the parents with the lecturers is found mutually enriching. This is an opportunity for the parents to clarify points and get help that might be needed.

- Once the student joins sports, she will not quit for any reason.
- Students must be ready to participate in intercollegiate matches held out of station.
- Students can join either **Sports or NCC, not both.**

GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

College Timings

- Monday to Friday : 9 am to 3.30 pm
On Saturdays : 9 am to 12.30 pm
- Students should reach college 10 minutes before the first bell.
- In the morning as they come, students should sit in their respective classes and spend the time relaxing to the soothing music played, which is followed by guided meditation.
- On teacher's arrival in the classroom, students must rise and remain standing till they have prayed, greeted the teacher and then take their seats.
- During Lunch break, other than PG students, no student is allowed to move out of the main gate/side gate.
- After every test and examination, marks will be enabled in the College App to be viewed by parents and the students.
- **Students who copy (malpractice) in college exams are not allowed to write the remaining scheduled exams and that day's answer paper will not be valued.**
- No meeting shall be held within the College premises, nor any new activity shall be taken up without the approval of the Principal.
- No collection of money/sale of tickets is permitted without the prior permission of the Principal.
- Even when students move about in the city or in public places the College expects them to conduct themselves in a way that brings credit to their Alma Mater.
- Students are responsible for the safety of their personal belongings, including books and umbrellas, all of which should bear the name of the owner.
- Students are expected to use the classroom furniture with care. Damaging the furniture, scribbling on the walls, etching on planks, desks or chairs will be considered a serious offence. Suitable action will be taken for any infringement of this rule.

- Students shall not give the College address for any correspondence. All letters addressed to students at their College address will be re-directed to their parents/guardian and the College shall not be held responsible for the loss of any letter, whatever be the nature of the correspondence. Letters officially addressed to the Principal should have reply postage enclosed.
- Outsiders are not permitted to attend College functions. Strict actions will be taken on those who bring outsiders into the campus.
- **Those students of our college, who take recourse to the social media to air their grievances against other students, staff member, the institution and other institutions of the campus on the basis of nonfactual, trumped-up, baseless, frivolous notions are liable to be penalised as per the cyber law. The penalty also can lead the student to being rusticated.**
- Under no circumstances, once a student answers her roll, shall she leave the college premises without the permission of the Principal till the end of the session. If for any reason she is required to go home in between a session, a written request to that effect should be made by the parent.
- Visitors, parents or guardians will not be allowed to communicate with any student during working hours without the permission of the Principal.
- Moving for games, laboratories, library or other activities should be done in silence and in an orderly way, without disturbing the other classes.
- No student should absent herself from answering the class tests/examinations except for reasons approved and the letter signed by the Principal.
- Using of foul language or abusive speech is viewed as a serious matter and will be dealt strictly.
- Discipline is an integral part of an individual. For serious offence warning will be given.

- The college is not responsible for any type of misconduct by the student outside its premises.
- **Smoking, vaping, consumption of alcohol, use of drugs is a punishable offence. Expulsion may be the consequence of such action.**

Mobile Phone culture is not conducive to learning atmosphere. They have also been found to facilitate immoral behavior and extravagance amongst youth. Hence as per the order of the pre-university department, students are strictly forbidden to carry mobiles or any electronic gadgets on the campus and anyone found doing so will be penalized. Confiscated mobiles will not be returned for a year.

Cameras are installed in the college and the campus. The principal and the faculty have the right to know the identity of every student who enters and exits the gates of St Agnes. Therefore every student will enter the gate with uniform prescribed by the college along with the college ID.

IDENTITY CARD AND CALENDAR

- A student who is admitted to the PU College receives an identity card and a college calendar.
- She shall enter all particulars on page 1 of the Calendar and get it attested by the Principal.
- Her calendar should have the specimen signature of the parent / guardian on the page set aside for leave note.

She shall wear the identity card and carry the calendar to the College daily. Any staff member as well as other lawful authorities of the PU College have the right to ask a student to produce the same at any time.

The identity card is required in order to enter the library and for the issue of the books in her name. It has to be brought along with her for every examination she answers in the College.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Parents are alerted to assume responsibility to see that their ward attends classes regularly and as a rule does not seek exemption from attending daily classes.
- If there is an important occasion within the immediate family that falls on a working day and requires the presence of family members for **more than three days, leave of absence (page no. 49) should be applied for in advance by the Parent.** Such permission, as a rule will not be granted if the occasion coincides with the dates of College Examination, Prayer Day or Retreat.
- Parents will **strictly avoid** fixing a routine **doctor's checkup** for their ward **during working hours.**
- **Absence without prior permission from College examinations and at the re-opening of classes after holidays will not be easily condoned.**
- If the student is absent for more than 3 days for reasons of ill health a certificate from the doctor is required stating illness and fitness.

- Students will not be allowed to leave college premises during the college hours unless parents/guardians produce a written note to the Principal before 9 am.
- A student requiring leave for any part of the day on account of sudden illness or such unavoidable circumstances, should obtain the permission of the class teacher and Principal before leaving the college. Absence record signed by parent/guardian shall be submitted the next working day itself.
- Continuous absence for 15 days from college without permission will lead to the removal of the student's name from the Admission Register. Admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right. The college authorities will have full discretion in this matter.

DRESS REGULATIONS

The individual student is a representative of College standards in matters of dress and deportment. With regard to dress, norms of simplicity, modesty and propriety are kept in mind.

Dress Code : The students have to compulsorily wear the uniform prescribed by the College till they answer the final examination. No other attire is permitted in the college premises throughout the working hours. No student will wear head scarf inside the class.

THE COLLEGE LIBRARY

The Library is a place of quiet study. **Strict Silence** must be observed at all times in and around the library.

1. The College Library is open only to the staff and students of the College.
2. The Library will be open every day from 8.45 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. On Saturdays 8.45 a.m. to 12.45 p.m.
3. The Procedure to use the library is as follows:
 - (i) Every student who wishes to use the library shall produce her identity card at the entrance.

- (ii) She shall keep her belongings on the rack kept outside the library. She will carry with her only the identity card, loose sheets of paper, pen and money purse (not bag).
 - (iii) She shall enter the library and use the reference section or magazine section for reading or taking down notes, which she shall do in perfect silence.
 - (iv) When a student gets out of the library she cannot carry any book out of the library except the books issued to her.
4. Three Borrower's Tickets will be issued to every student at the beginning of the year. A student should present the Borrower's Ticket as well as her identity card each time she wants a book to be issued or returned to the library. The Borrower's Tickets must be kept carefully by the student and are to be used for the entire course of study, until the student leaves the college. If the tickets are lost, the students should report the fact immediately to the librarian and make arrangements to get another set of tickets with a fine of Rs. 25 per ticket.

5. **ISSUE OF BOOKS**

- i) Books will be issued to the students on all the days of the week.
- (ii) Students should apply for library books on the prescribed application slip which should be dropped into the box. Books will be issued to the students within 24 hours of application the latest.
- (iii) No student is allowed to take more than 3 books at a time (2 reference and 1 general).
- (iv) When a book which has been applied for, is not available, a reject slip will be issued. In this case the student may ask for another book in its place.

- (v) A reference book must be returned after a week. The book may, however, be renewed for another week, if there is no other application for the said book.
 - (vi) From the lending library, books will be issued to the needy students. They may use these books for the full academic year and return the same just after the final examination of the year.
 - (vii) If a holiday falls on any of the days specified for the issuing of books, the librarian will notify on the board the alternate date for the issue of books for that particular week.
 - (viii) In case of emergency when a student needs a book on a day other than the day specified for the issue of books she will seek the help of the staff member concerned with the subject or the Librarian in case of a general book.
6. Students shall note that the library is not a place of recreation or relaxation. Any student found misbehaving in the library shall surrender the identity card to the library staff. Her case will be reported to the Principal by the Librarian. She will not be given any library facility until she gets the Principal's permission in writing.
 7. All books, magazines and furniture must be handled with care. Books lost, torn, defaced, marked or damaged in any way shall have to be replaced by the borrower along with the fine as fixed by the Principal. Students are expected to examine the books issued to them and draw the attention of the librarian if they are found damaged. A student caught in damaging the furniture, etching or scribbling on tables, chairs etc. will forfeit the privilege of using the library for the year.
 8. Sub-lending of Library books, whether in or out of College, is strictly prohibited.
 9. Periodic changes regarding the rules and regulations of the library will be put up on the notice board.

ATTENDANCE REGULATIONS AND SHORTAGE OF ATTENDANCE

- A student must put in a minimum of **75% of attendance in every subject** each year, taking theory and practicals as separate units.
- Students with shortage of attendance should make up for it before midterm examination failing which she will not be allowed to answer the exam.
- Parents of students with shortage of attendance will be called for a meeting.

- **Irregularity in attending Moral Education and Catechism classes, absence from daily lectures and a failure to answer class tests and terminal examinations, as well as insubordination and obscenity in word or act will be sufficient cause for a student to be asked to leave the College any part of the year. The student will not be re-admitted thereafter. Such students will also be deprived of any prize or scholarship they may be receiving.**

❖ **ELIGIBILITY TO II PUC EXAMINATIONS:**

Admission to II PUC Public Examination shall be open to candidates who have

- (i) Passed I Year PUC Annual Examination.
- (ii) Undergone prescribed course of study in the corresponding year.
- (iii) Secured the minimum attendance prescribed under the regulations.
- (iv) Shown satisfactory progress and conduct as certified by the Head of the Institution.

LABORATORY RULES

1. Students should be regular and punctual in their practical work in the laboratories.
2. All equipment and material given to students for practical work should be handled with care. Damages and breakages should be paid for. Strict silence shall be maintained in the laboratories during the practical work.
3. Students are forbidden to enter the laboratory except with the permission of the Lecturer-in-charge.
4. Students who are irregular in practical work are not eligible for promotion or selection for PU Board Examination.

5. Students are requested to remove their footwear and keep it on the racks, provided for the same before going into the computer laboratory.
6. Students should bring their laboratory manual, observation note book and practical record for every experiment.
7. Students should submit the completed record book to every lab failing which they will not be allowed to perform the next experiment.
8. Submission of completed record is mandatory for answering the final practical exam.

A VERY IMPORTANT NOTE

Admissions are made only for the current academic year on the clear understanding that those who are admitted will fully accept the rules and regulations in force in the College which may be reframed from time to time irrespective of the fact that the PUE Board Regulations may not contain such rules or these rules are not in force in other similar Institutions. Every student admitted to the College is bound by the College Regulations as may be notified from time to time by the College.

A student found disobeying the regulations such as:

- **Violation of dress code**
- **Irregularity to class**
- **Shortage of attendance**
- **Absenting from the exams**
- **And showing indifference to the management**

WILL NOT BE RE-ADMITTED.

MERIT CERTIFICATES

ELIGIBILITY:

1. A student must answer and pass in every paper of the I Test and Mid-term examination.
2. Should have 75% attendance (minimum) in all the subjects.
3. Obtain the prescribed aggregate and the prescribed minimum of marks in I Test & Mid-term Exam.
4. Prescribed aggregate: 80%

Prescribed minimum in individual subjects:

85% for Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Biology, Home Science, Statistics, Computer Science, Electronics, Basic Mathematics, Accountancy.

80% for all other subjects

ISSUING OF CERTIFICATES

1. All applications for certificates must be made available to the Principal in writing and must contain the following particulars:--
 - a) Student's Name and initials.
 - b) The date of joining the College and the class in which the student was originally enrolled.
 - c) The class in which the student was studying at the time of leaving, the date of leaving, and reg. number.
 - d) The language under Part I and Subjects under Part II.
2. Certificates will be issued only after 48 hours of notice.
3. Certificates must be taken from the office in person.
4. **No certificate or marks cards will be handed over to other persons without a letter of authorization.**
5. If they have to be sent by post, a self-addressed registered cover must be left at the office, with the required stamp and certification fee.

6. Transfer and all the other certificates will be issued to the student only on payment of the yearly fee / other dues to the college.
7. The Transfer and other certificates in the case of a student who withdraws from the Institution at the end of the First Year course, will be issued only after the declaration of the result of the examination.
8. The Official Conduct Certificate has to be earned by a student for her good conduct and behaviour during her PU course. It will not be issued as a matter of course. The Principal may refuse the Conduct Certificate to any student whose conduct in her opinion has not been satisfactory.

IMPORTANT POINTS SUMMED UP AND COMMUNICATED TO THE STUDENTS AND THEIR PARENTS

The Management and Staff of St Agnes PU College warmly welcome every student with the sincere desire that every one of them realizes the responsibility entailed in having the privilege to be on its rolls.

It is to be hoped that the student puts in every effort to benefit from the education offered and in her turn shares with her less privileged sisters the knowledge and the enlightenment that she has received on the campus. To achieve this, the co-operation of both students and parents is necessary especially on the following points:-

- 1. In a world that is fast losing its sense of direction and values the college aspires to direct the gaze of its students to eternal values- to God in whose love we are all bound together as children unmindful of caste, creed and social status. All students inspired and guided by the Staff will make it a point to be present inside the classroom daily by 9.00 a.m., respectfully join in the meditation and morning prayer in an atmosphere of quiet silence and receive grace from God to live the day fruitfully.*
- 2. The College expects its students to abide by the DRESS REGULATIONS mentioned in page 26 accordingly of the Calendar and thereby aim at acquiring the deeper values sought through its observance.*
- 3. EXCELLENCE both in studies and behaviour is the goal set before every Agnesian. Parents are expected to see that the students strive to acquire the principles of regular attendance at class hours, intelligent participation in the classroom and systematic study at home.*
- 4. It will be beneficial for students to attend weekly Catechism/Moral Education and Value Education classes. Catholic students will attend Holy Mass once in a month arranged for them. The annual retreat as well as other faith formation programmes arranged by the College are compulsory for every student.*

5. Programmes specifically arranged for a particular group/ Association/Class and communicated to the students in advance, must be attended by all concerned without fail.

6. Every student is expected to spend at least one hour per week in the LIBRARY.

The Library is intended to be a place of silence for concentrated reading and study. Hence STUDENTS WILL STRICTLY AVOID RELAXING OUTSIDE AND AROUND THE LIBRARY DURING WORKING HOURS, AS WELL AS BEFORE THE COMMENCEMENT OF THE MORNING SESSION. This rule must be respected and followed at all times.

7. The college will hold the parents responsible to see that the students answer the unit tests and the EXAMINATIONS HELD. If absence at any examination is justifiable THE PARENTS MUST PERSONALLY NOTIFY THE REASON FOR ABSENCE. Leave notes, medical certificates etc. presented later will not be accepted or considered.

8. The Staff is always eager to help students acquire excellence in their respective subjects. They consider it their special mission to coach slow learners. Therefore, students are encouraged to approach members of the Staff even outside class hours to benefit from their generosity.

9. PARENTS are expected to come and meet the teachers and follow up the progress of the students in class, as well as their attendance and general behaviour. PARENTS ARE EXPECTED TO ATTEND ALL PROGRAMMES ARRANGED BY THE PRINCIPAL AND NOTIFIED TO THEM IN WRITING.

VENERABLE MOTHER VERONICA, A WOMAN FOR OUR TIMES

Mother Veronica nee Sophie Leeves was born on Oct 1st, 1823 in Constantinople, in a cultured, English Anglican family. She was gifted with singular talents of mind and heart, which were nurtured by sound education and wide experience, as she was well travelled. God took possession of her heart so powerfully, that she first broke off her engagement to a Marine officer whom she loved, and then responded generously to the call to Religious life.

Mother Veronica was open and generous in responding to God's will, and after much struggle, she finally found the Congregation of the Apostolic Carmel in Bayonne, France in July 1868. Henceforth, her sisters across the globe would work enthusiastically for the upliftment of women through all-round education.

The first group of The Apostolic Carmelites arrived in India in November 1870. The first Convent was established at St Ann's (Mother house) in the Diocese of Mangaluru, Karnataka.

Today the Apostolic Carmel has spread its branches in 9 countries including Sri Lanka, Pakistan, Africa, Bahrain and Italy. In 181 convents in 75 dioceses, we now have nearly 1300 sisters working in Degree and postgraduate Colleges, B.Ed & M.Ed Colleges, D.Ed Colleges, Higher Secondary Schools, Special Schools, Nursery Schools, Play Schools, Technical Schools, Women's Welfare Centres, Crèches, Healthcare Centres, Hostels, Boarding Houses, Children's Homes and Day Care Centre. It also has a number of Literacy Centers and National Open Schools. The sisters work for the training and rehabilitation of women and children in prison as well as working for the integral development of the poor and needy in rural and tribal areas.

Mother Veronica's heroic obedience to the will of God, her life of faith and prayer, her wholehearted commitment, outstanding humility and courage, remain as an inspiration to all who seek to dedicate themselves to the transformation of Society through the loving service of humanity, especially the less privileged.

Mother Veronica was declared 'Venerable' by His Holiness Pope Francis on July 7, 2014.
