


The models who represented the States and Union Territories gave information about each State and territory. At the end of the performance all the students who participated in the programme did the last formation along with the NCC cadets.



SESSION BY DR RAMEELA SHEKAR



As a teacher it is very important that we look not just into the curricular development of a student but also take care to see that the student is developing well mentally too. Sexual exploitation of women and children are on the rise every year. It is very important for us as teachers to always be alert and have knowledge about what to do, when we find a child or a person we know being sexually exploited. Dr Rameela Shekhar, a well-known Mental Health Professional and Trainer, took up a session for the lecturers of St Agnes PU College, regarding the topic 'Sexual exploitation, consequences and the need for counselling'.

The session gave us a view into what kind of situation a victim of abuse goes through. Dr Rameela Shekhar spoke about some cases she has come across while working as a mental health professional, which gave us a complete view of the state which a sexual abuse victim would be in after the abuse. It was frightening to know that an abuser can be in the form of not just a stranger but can also be in the form of a father, a brother, uncles and aunts. The abused victim can face serious mental trauma and should always be handled with care. Laws under POCSO takes care to see that the victim doesn't face trouble and the situation is taken care of very delicately considering the privacy of the victim. The session also highlighted on the importance of counselling. It is very much necessary to erase the taboo surrounding the topic of counselling.

It was a totally enriching and enlightening session which was much needed for all of us to get a better understanding of our role as a lecturer towards our students. As the great American Historian, Henry Brook Adams rightly said 'A teacher effects eternity, they can never know where their influence stops'. We as lecturers need to take up the responsibility of being a good influence to a child in distress and bring about a good change in the child's life.

St. Antony Ashram, Jeppu, Mangalore.


