## PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE







St Agnes PU College held a very successful session on a very important topic – 'Sexual Exploitation and Counselling'. Dr Rameela Shekhar, a very well-known mental health professional and trainer was the resource person.

She grasped the attention of the audience from the very beginning. She narrated a few incidents of sexual exploitation that takes place day in and day out. It was devastating to hear such horrific incidents. It is sad to know that girls and women of all ages have to experience or witness such events that happen in public or in some cases even in their own homes. Dr Rameela Shekhar also said that people who were exploited had terrible trauma. Thankfully, some have healed from their trauma with the help of counselling. She highlighted that we should have confidence in ourselves, confide in someone whom we trust and most importantly we should always learn to say 'NO'. She further explained that sexual harassment is not just physical but verbal and visual too. This information was new to me since mainly we are taught that sexual exploitation is only limited to physical exploitation.

Sexual exploitation is a traumatic experience that can scar one for the rest of their life. Giving helpful advices and creating awareness on this topic among the young minds had a great impact on us and helped the students to be aware and alert. ### CRAFT SEMINAR

CRAFT was the acronym given for 'Creating a Resourceful, Accomplishing, Fascinating Teaching and Learning experience', a one-day seminar held at Ocean Pearl on 30 June 2022. It was hosted by Swastika National College for teachers of pre university colleges with the intention of bringing forth the Perennial Concept – one of continuous growth among educators. The resource person was Ms. Sandhya Verma, a well-known facilitator and corporate trainer with many years of experience in conducting such sessions to her credit. Short five-minute activities were suggested to be conducted to bring in a proactive environment into the classroom. It was a learning experience giving us numerous interesting techniques to use in a classroom set up to make teaching and learning an inspiring exercise. The importance of keeping ourselves updated in order to bring something new to the teaching table was the thought that we carried with us as we went back after a well spent and fruitful day.



# INAUGURATION SALES


