



She emphasized on the importance of choosing a right career. She shared her mantra of success - Do what you love to do She encouraged the students to be optimistic and urged them to face the various challenges they come across boldly.



The winners of various events were honoured by Ester Noronha and Sr Dr Lydia Fernandes, the Joint Secretary of St Agnes Institutions. At the high school level, St Aloysius High School bagged the overall championship while Mount, Carmel central school, won the runners up trophy. Under PU category, Expert Residential PU College Valachil bagged the winner's trophy while St Aloysius PU College got the runners up. The participants also shared their experiences and were overwhelmed with the variety of competitions that were conducted. They enjoyed being a part of Agnathon even though it was online. My overall experience of organising Agnathon was exhilarating. I thought that conducting this online wouldn't be fun but it was completely the opposite. The planning began a month ago. The theme of Agnathon 2k21 was rainbow with the tag line, 'A blend of talents'. Each of the seven competitions were represented by one of 7 colours of rainbow. It all began with a promo video competition that was conducted for the students of St Agnes PU College. The best promo video was done by Alice Lobo of II CSBA which was circulated to all schools and colleges. The registrations for Agnathon were done online through Google Forms. Colourful posters were handed over to nearby schools and colleges with a provision of QR code for accessing the brochure. Things went on smoothly without any hurdles as the work was distributed among the lecturers and each member of the cabinet was given different charges.



Carvastic was a unique event. It was very much appreciated as it is rare to find such an event in an online fest. The entries sent for Pensmith were extra ordinary. The participants proved their artistique mettle. Poster attack was another live event conducted through Google meet. The participants, beautifully depicted the COVID lock down scenario in their posters. The judges of Thunderstruck were mesmerized by the soulful singing of the participants. The entries of Danfactio were liked worldwide as they were uploaded in Agnes PUC Facebook account, as maximum likes was one of the judgement criteria. The models presented in technova were indeed of great calibre. The Star of Agnathon the fun competition - the cream of the fest, the final competition was truly an amazing blend of talents. E-certificates were provided to all the participants. Teachers had formed a stage committee who were given in charge of the backdrop for Agnathon. Their efforts be it from staying back after classes or going to college during their Dasara vacation for preparing the backdrop was absolutely amazing. I was a part of Star of Agnathon committee. This particular competition was conducted live through Google meet. The competitions went by smoothly and I learned a lot of things while organising this competition. The form of Self-Defence taught to us by our mentor/guide/guru Arun Kumar was karate. The first and foremost technique taught to us was meditation. Every class started with a prayer which was done kneeling with back straight, eyes closed, and head down for 3 minutes. It ended with a ground bow. This enhanced our meditation skill. After prayer, students were made to do warm up exercises to prevent hurts during learning techniques. Various punches such as face punch, middle punch and down punch were taught. Though they are sum of the basics, each punch required power and concentration. Techniques like open hand forward and sideward, elbow hit, short punches etc were taught. Other than punches and hits, block such as down block, upper block, inner and outer forum blocks were taught too.

Kicks such as thrust kick, side kick sidewise, side kick forward, back kick and slap kick were taught too. Students were put in pairs and were trained to fight in situations as well. 

To celebrate the occasion of the 152nd year of the establishment of Apostolic Carmel, India and to remember Venerable Mother Veronica on her 115th death anniversary, St Agnes PU College, conducted a quiz on the life of Mother Veronica on Saturday 20th November, 2021.

A week long preparations were done from 15th 20th November, where every morning we heard about the life history of our foundress. This whole week was also dedicated to our dear Mother Veronica. A special thanksgiving mass was also offered on 19th November – the Esostablishment day. Her heroic obedience to the will of God and the winding path of suffering she trod from being Sophie Leeves to become to Sr Veronica of the Passion was particularly remembered on 16th November- her 115th death anniversary day.

The purpose of this quiz was to introduce Venerable Mother Veronica to those who do not know her. Through his chosen people God fulfils his plans and purpose towards the progress and development of humankind. God called and chose Venerable Mother Veronica from the Anglican church to the Roman Catholic Church and to Religious Wisdomlife and later to be the foundress of the Apostolic Carmel Congregation. Mother Veronica, who dedicated herself to build an educative community in and through the Apostolic Carmel, stands as an inspiration to all of us even today.



Our foundress Mother Veronica was born on 1st October, 1823 as Sophie Leeves to Mr Henry Daniel Leaves and Marina Haultain. Sophie means ‘wisdom’ and true to her name she grew up to be a very wise person. She had balanced outlook in life. She gave great importance to prayer and reading the Bible daily. But in the depths of her heart she felt that something was still lacking in her life. Gradually she discovered that God wanted her to dedicate her life in His service as a religious sister.

From the life of Mother Veronica, I personally learnt that God Alone Suffices. This is the truth. He is our security, in Him we live and move. He is a banker who never fails in him we find our rest. He never changes, he knows what is best, and she also tells us that, people who speak the truth and stand for it can respect themselves, be trust-worthy and fearless; as ultimately truth will triumph. The meaning of the name ‘Veronica’ is ‘true image’. All through her life she reflected the face of God in the depth of her being.

Mother Veronica lights up our way even today. Indeed it is the face of Mother Veronica who keeps smiling at her children all over the world! The journey of a hundred and fifty two years of the Apostolic Carmel began with a single step; because of the courage of a woman, who in response to God’s call dared to take that first step. Her beautiful life is a constant inspiration to all of us; to strive for what is good, noble, true and lasting.
